- On June 14th The Suffolk County Medical Society and the Suffolk Academy of Medicine held its Annual Dinner and Installation of Officers. It was a great a time of celebration as our new officers were sworn in, awards were distributed, future student doctors were recognized, and our members networked and socialized.
- On June 19th SCMS along with Mr. Moe Auster, held a conference call with Senator Gaughran's office and addressed many issues for physicians, including liability reforms and the consequences and challenges of legalizing recreational marijuana.
- On June 20th; RuskinMoscouFaltischek, P.C. held a webinar on "Preventing Sexual Harassment in the Workplace" for members of the Nassau County Medical Society, The Suffolk County Medical Society and the Independent Physicians Association of Nassau and Suffolk. The event may lead to additional sessions, as this was a well-attended webinar to help fulfill the new mandated regulations.
- Our physician leadership was able to attend the Physician Leadership Seminar held on June 21st 22nd at the Hyatt in Hauppauge by the Medical Educational & Scientific Foundation of New York, INC. The seminar proved very useful and helped extend our business management visions and creativity beyond the confines of our usual medical framework.
