- Question from the committee Why is there so much debate on topics that have been already settled. We've had vaccine deniers for as long as we've had vaccines.
- We've had mask refusals for as long as we've had mask interventions. There have always been vaccine mandates. There is the question "can the government"
  - mandate?" and the answer to that is "yes". The question that will always be debated is "how"? There is still room to argue "how"?
    - **b) Why Vaccine Mandates Work** William Valenti, MD Chair of MSSNY Infectious Disease Committee.

Managing health emergencies requires extraordinary measures. It is science vs. 23 24 virus vs people. People don't understand contagion. If they understood contagion, they would understand the mandates. People have a habit of creating their own 25 science. Vaccine mandates work. Polio, smallpox, measles. Mandates are 26 27 motivators in health care. Mandates cause action. What is the shift in in 28 understanding health science. Social media has added a level of complexity. This is the pandemic of the digital era. It will provide information to a large number of 29 30 people whether it is valid or not. Polio was more of a childhood disease, so there was more sympathy. Think back to the damage the MMR and autism 31 32 misinformation caused. This virus is more of a respiratory virus. It is dangerous. The message needs to be controlled, otherwise the message gets blurry. What is 33 the patient responsibility in this? We need to be better informed. The idea that this 34 is not a childhood illness is wrong. 20,000 children have died from COVID this year. 35 This is not going away. The mandates will work, even then its going to take about 4 36 37 years. 90% of the population will need to be vaccinated in order to stop transmission. We also need to do a better job educating doctors. Ivermectin did not 38 work well. There will be a drug soon for prevention and protection. Monoclonal 39 antibodies will also soon be more readily available. This pipeline is about to break 40 41 wide open.
