
About us



- The Retiree Health Alliance is an alliance between Empire BlueCross BlueShield and EmblemHealth.
- The Retiree Health Alliance brings together senior-focused care management, member services, account management, and other operational areas to offer integrated, seamless, specialized Medicare Advantage benefits and services.

Introducing the Alliance

The Alliance will serve up to 240,000 members, with 175,000 residing throughout NYS; members will hold a single, co-branded ID card with the Medicare Advantage Plus logo



History

Empire BCBS and EmblemHealth have served City of New York active employees, retired members, and labor unions for 80 years. Empire BCBS and EmblemHealth previously served City of New York retirees through two separate Medicare supplemental plans.

- Empire BCBS administered
 Part A benefits
- EmblemHealth administered
 Part B benefits

The City of New York awarded the group retiree business to the Retiree Health Alliance, effective January 1, 2022.

About City of New York retirees



Which City of New York retirees are eligible to enroll in NYC Medicare Advantage Plus?

 Retirees must be eligible for Medicare Parts A and B.



Which City of New York retirees will be transitioning to NYC Medicare Advantage Plus?

- All Medicare-eligible retirees will transition to the NYC Medicare Advantage Plus effective January 1, 2022.
- City of New York retirees are provided an opt out period and may elect to keep their current coverage.



What is the service area?

- NYC Medicare Advantage Plus is a Medicare Advantage PPO with a national service area.
- Approximately 180,000 live within the New York City metropolitan area.

What is changing?

Effective January 1, 2022, City of New York retirees will transition to NYC Medicare Advantage Plus, a Medicare Advantage PPO.



One ID card for members

Prior authorization (PA) may be required for some services

Contracted providers are responsible for obtaining PA

All claims (facility and professional) will be submitted to Empire beginning January 1, 2022

Providers will no longer file claims to traditional Medicare

NYC Medicare Advantage Plus member ID card

- Prefix N6Y
- Members will have one ID card
- Branded with Empire, EmblemHealth, and City of New York
- MA PPO Suitcase Network Sharing

As of January 1, 2022, eligibility and benefits associated with a member can be determined by:

Claims and prior authorizations

Claims submission



Empire and EmblemHealth encourage the submission of claims electronically through the electronic data interchange (EDI), either by using a clearinghouse, billing company, or sending directly. Availity serves as our gateway for all EDI transactions.



Providers can also register with Availity at availity.com to become a direct submitter.



To initiate the electronic claims submission process or to obtain additional information, contact Availity Client Services at 800-AVAILITY (800-282-4548). If you have a relationship with a clearinghouse, please work with them to ensure connectivity with Availity.

Prior authorizations

Important things to remember:

- Certain medical procedures require the submission and approval of prior authorization.
- All providers will follow Empire BCBS authorization guidelines for NYC Medicare Advantage Plus members.
- Contracted providers must request prior authorization.
- All inpatient admissions require prior authorization.


A **Precertification Lookup Tool** is located under *Payer Spaces* on the Availity portal:




Accessing Payer Spaces from the Availity portal

AIM Specialty Health

AlM Specialty Health® manages precertification for: radiology, cardiology, sleep, musculoskeletal (MSK), genetic testing, medical oncology, and radiation oncology.

For services that are scheduled to begin on or after January 1, 2022, all providers must contact AIM beginning December 20, 2021 to obtain PA review.

Home Health claims processing, network, and utilization management is delegated to **myNexus**.

Prior authorization must be requested through myNexus.

Noncontracted providers

Noncontracted providers

- If you are not contracted with Empire or EmblemHealth, you can continue to see City of New York retirees.
- City of New York retirees have no cost differential when seeing in-or out-of-network providers – the cost share is always the same.
- Out-of-network providers will be reimbursed 100% of the current CMS fee schedule less the member cost share.



Noncontracted claims submission

- Prior authorization is not required but recommended for noncontracted providers.
- Prior authorization can be obtained from Availity, phone, or fax.

Important reminders

- Balance billing of Medicare Advantage members is prohibited by CMS.
- Member cost share can be collected at the time of service.
- Contracted providers must obtain prior authorization and follow Empire's prior authorization guidelines.
- Any Medicare healthcare professional can provide care to NYC Medicare Advantage Plus members no contract is needed.
