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- 4) Presentation by Maureen Killackey, MD, NYS Department of Health's Bureau of Cancer and Early Detection Council "Delivery of High Quality
- 12 Cancer Care in NYS: Well kept Secrets?" copies of slides attached to minutes.
- 13 Dr. Killackey recommended that the committee members download a white paper.
- 14 The American Cancer Society produced a white paper titled: ACS Guide on Safely
- 15 Resuming and Promoting Cancer Screening During the COVID 19 Pandemic. Dr.
- 16 Killackey recommended that you download:

- 19 you will find messaging, education identifying disparities, overcoming barriers, fact
- 20 sheets and guidelines to assist you. Many cancer screening centers signed up for
- the initiative "Return to Screening". There has been a NYS Action team created to
- focus on survivorship. Survivors are seriously missing follow up treatment for their
- 23 physical needs and their psycho-social needs. There is an inconsistent level of care

- 24 between a patients' primary physician and the oncologist. George Washington University has a Cancer Survivorship e-learning series bit.ly/PCPE-Learning 25 Each module includes: a survivor interview, narrated presentations, pre and post 26
- assessments, list of resources and one hour CME/CNE per module. 27
- There was a survey sent to 60 cancer centers across the state. Of the 60 55 28
- 29 responded. We asked them to inventory what they are doing in their hospitals to
- and in their region regarding cancer survivorship. Sharing patient care between the 30
- 31 oncologists and primary care physicians. The NYS DOH Department of Cancer and
- Early Detection Council has cancer physicians from across that state and many 32
- 33 different organizations. We do not have one primary care physician working with
- us. We would love to have a member of MSSNY on our board. Dr. Korytko from this 34
- committee is the Director of Survivorship at Bassett Healthcare. Dr. Fishman 35
- pointed out that things are being done through MSSNY. There have been talks on 36
- 37 HPV, Colorectal Cancer screening and then next month Lung Cancer screening.
- 38 Someone suggested "cluster screening". If someone goes in for their colonoscopy,
- that would be the time to do the lung screening, or the mammogram. Further, 39
- 40 there was discussion of the under utilization of the PET CT in screening and
- diagnosing. THE NCCN came out with a new study and recommends PET CT as the 41
- best diagnostic test. The comment was made that it's because the insurance 42
- companies won't allow it. The PET CT will allow patients to avoid operations that 43
- they don't need and it's been argued all the time. Do we need MSSNY to take up 44
- 45 advocacy for PET CT's as a needed screening method. Should there be a resolution
- to MSSNY Council or the House of Delegates. Perhaps if there was significant 46
- 47 evidence presented that it would save money in the long run, the insurance
- companies might be swayed. 48
- Dr. Draker suggested that this be further discussed with the committee, so a 49
- cogent resolution or recommendation can be prepared. There is no MSSNY policy on 50
- this at this time. Dr. Fishman indicated he would be happy to lead the charge on 51 52
 - this. Including genetic testing as well. Women's health care would be dramatically
- 53 improved with this enhanced testing.

Dr. Draker indicated that there were several actionable topics that this committee should work on for the May 4th meeting. He will be in touch with Pat Clancy about these topics. He encouraged all committee members to reach out if there was anything else they would like on the agenda for May 4, 2022.
